
Student Spotlight

As we gear up for another academic year, it's important to remember the significance of sports in our school life. Along with football and volleyball, we have added cross-country to the fall season.



Our Varsity football began this season with Head Coach Tony McGeary. Coach McGeary graduated from THA in 1982. He has led our team to a 5-3 season so far with a Region title matchup with Patrick Henry Academy on October 28. Our Varsity Rebels will be headed to the playoffs on November 4.

Our Varsity volleyball team, coached by Alicia Crosby, ended the season with a trip to the State Championship. The Lady Rebels played on October 20 in Myrtle Beach, SC as a number three-seed team. They played a double-elimination match against Marlboro Academy.

Cross-Country with the leadership and coaching of Col Scott Gibson III finished second in the region race as a first year program. The team has seven male runners and competed in four large meets. Jaden Powell earned a medal as one of the top ten finishers on October 18th, and all runners ran their best times of the season at the same meet! The team participates in SCISA Finals at Heathwood Hall on October 28.



THA's cheer team assisted with the mini cheer event again this year. We had 42 mini-cheerleaders, a seven-year record. Our competition cheer team competes several times in October and will head to the state finals in November!
